

Award Guidelines

❖ It was updated by the Board on 03/20/2025.

Awards	Guideline Changes
1. Steven F. Messner Outstanding Book Award	\$500 cash award Eligible years: 3 calendar year; 2021, 2022,2023 and 2024 are considered for 2025 call.
2. Jianhong Liu Outstanding Paper Award	\$200 cash award
3. Shanhe Jiang Outstanding Student Paper Award	Beginning in 2025, <u>Luye Li</u> , Ph.D., will co-fund the Jiang <u>Shanhe</u> Student Paper Award alongside Dr. <u>Shanhe Jiang</u> . The award amount will be \$350 per recipient (excluding Honorable Mentions). From 2025 to 2029, the prize will be financed through a contribution of \$200 from Dr. <u>Shanhe Jiang</u> 's donation (current balance: \$1,175) and \$150 from Dr. <u>Luye Li</u> 's donation (current balance: \$1,000). The name of the award will remain unchanged. a) Expectation: The award is intended to support students pursuing scholarship in the field of Criminology and Criminal Justice. b) Requirement 1: The Ad Hoc Award Review Committee (or its equivalent body) shall be comprised of scholars holding a doctoral degree. c) Requirement 2: The Ad Hoc Award Review Committee (or its equivalent body) shall not evaluate candidate papers solely on their <u>publishability</u> . Instead, the committee should assess the potential of each paper in alignment with the award's purpose of fostering and supporting student scholarship. d) The award committee chair has voting rights; if necessary, the board will remove applicants' identity before circulating papers to the award committee; the award applicants do not need to submit their CVs along with their application materials.



ACCCJ Awards Guidelines

To manage awards committees and ensure a transparent and fair award process, *ACCCJ Awards Guidelines* (hereby the Guidelines) is hereby enacted.

I. ACCCJ Awards

There are 7 ACCCJ awards, and 4 awards are under the Donation and Naming Rights Rules.* Donors' involvement of awards related affairs (e.g., advice, eligibility and criteria, selection process, etc.) should refer to the Naming Right rules (<https://accj.org/donation-and-naming-rights-rules/>).

- (1) Steven F. Messner Outstanding Book Award*
- (2) ACCCJ Outstanding Paper Award;
- (3) Ivan Sun Young Scholar Outstanding Research Award*;
- (4) Shanhe Jiang Outstanding Student Paper Award*;
- (5) Hong Lu Outstanding Student Service Award*;
- (6) ACCCJ Student Travel Award;
- (7) President's Service Award.

II. Award Director

Award Director (hereby Director) is one of the current Board Members who is appointed by the current ACCCJ President to be in charge of the awards. The Director oversees all award committees, initiates award rules for new awards, updates the current award rules, ensures the Guidelines be followed, and serves as a liaison between Award Committees and the Board.

- Director is the Chair of President's Service Award Committee (7)
- Director shall not chair any other award committees (Awards (1) ~ (6)) unless under certain circumstances

III. Award Chair and Award Committees

- All Award Chairs/committee members serve a 1-year term.
 - A total of 2 consecutive years on the same award committee is encouraged, but is ineligible for the third year.
 - Award Chairs/committee members may serve on a maximum of 3 award committees in a given year.
 - Board members may serve on a maximum of 2 award committees.
- With their consent, Award Chairs may be appointed by the President or the Director (with the recommendation of the President, prior Award Chair, the Board, or the Board of Advisors).
 - Award Chairs will form their committee. The *minimum* requirement of a total of committee members and notes for each award is listed below:





